## CS 101-04-20F: Website Construction

### Assignment 2

Due: Wednesday 2 September 2020 10:00 A.M. EDT

For this assignment, you will need to make TWO html files. One file—and you may give this any reasonable name you care to—should be a page of information on any topic you like. Each of you is an expert in something; write a page on that something. Your page should have at least three sections. Additionally, your page should not be of uniform format. You should vary the colors and the fonts and the sizes and the styles, etc., so that your page looks really cool (and so you get experience using CSS).

Your other file will be your standard “index.html” file. It should link to your information page three times. One link should be directly to the first section, one directly to the second section, and one directly to the third section. Make sure your index page has some relevant text about the page you're linking to (i.e. don't just make it three links). Format it so that it looks cool, too. For this assignment (and all future ones), you are to use CSS for all formatting. Do not use the old deprecated format commands.

Also, please proofread your web pages for spelling and grammar. Everyone misspells and makes stupid grammatical errors; however, it is really irritating to see atrocious grammar on the web, and, in fact, it reflects poorly on job applications if a prospective employer finds your web page devoid of any semblance of proper English. (It is possible I know this from personal experience...)

Your webpage needs to be stored in your web folder, along with a menu page or it won't be visible from the web. The menu page needs to be in the top level of your W: drive. Your webpage itself should be in a folder called “HW2” in the root of your W: drive.

I also need a second copy of it in your CS101-04-20F folder, so that I can grade it and make comments. Create a folder called “HW2” in the top level of your CS101-04-20F folder and place a copy of your webpage in that folder. Also place a (possibly empty) file or folder called “DONE” in this folder. When I see the DONE file in your HW2 folder, I will know to grade your assignment. Note: Your file must be called “DONE”, exactly. It can't be called “done” or “DONE.txt” or anything like that.

Your menu page needs to be in your W: drive, but *NOT* your CS101-04-20F folder.

Your DONE file needs to be in your HW2 folder within your CS101-04-20F folder, but *NOT* in your W: drive.

Your assignment has to be in an HW2 folder in *BOTH* your W: drive and your CS101-04-20F folder.
